## Name and Shame: Help us keep Boston tidy

Can you help identify any of these people who Boston Borough Council want to speak to in connection with incidents of littering, spitting, urination and fly tipping in the town?

They were all captured on the council's CCTV system.

The council wants to know who these people are and where they live so it can speak to them. All information received from the public will be confidential and the identities of those who pass on information will never be revealed.

Cllr Michael Brookes, Boston Borough Council's portfolio holder for waste services, said: "Cleanliness of the streets and public areas is a priority for our residents. Helping reveal the

identities of those who deliberately drop litter and fail to clean up after their dogs should never be seen as telling tales. It should be seen as helping control the problem of littering and rightly penalising those who deliberately cause it. Everyone knows that they shouldn't drop waste, spit or urinate in the street or any public place.

"This initiative in past years has been successful in reducing amounts of litter. It makes those who drop litter think again about the possible consequences. Hopefully they will then dispose of litter responsibly."

Those identified deliberately dropping litter will be pursued and issued with a £75 fixed penalty notice or be taken to court. Littering includes spitting, urinating and throwing down cigarette ends. *Read more at <http://bit.ly/2tzXZhr>*
