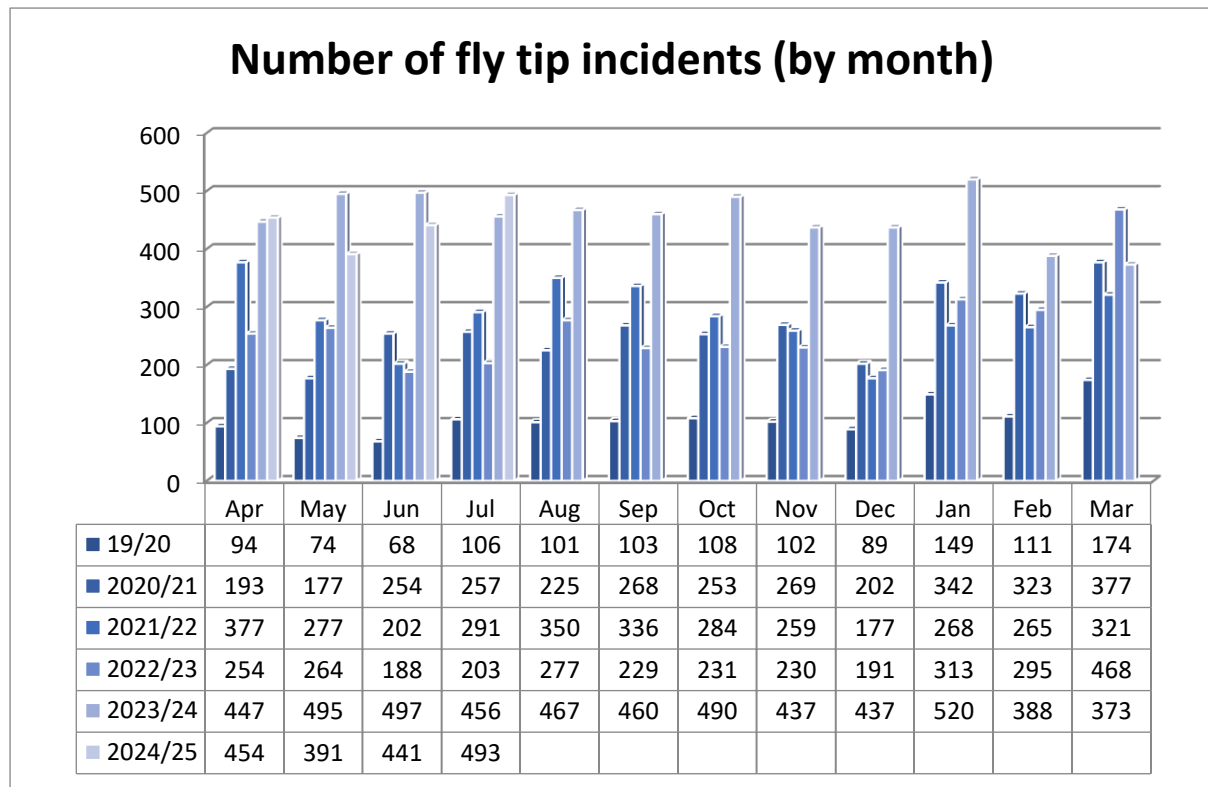
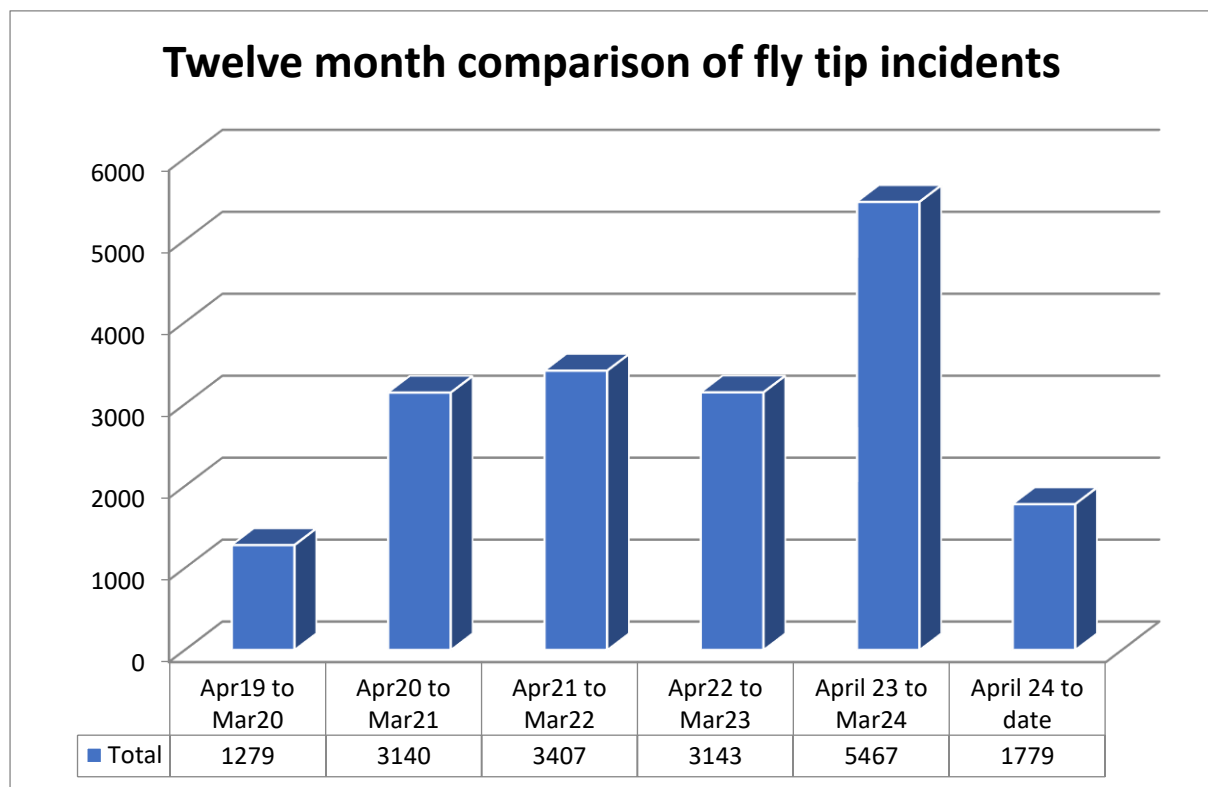


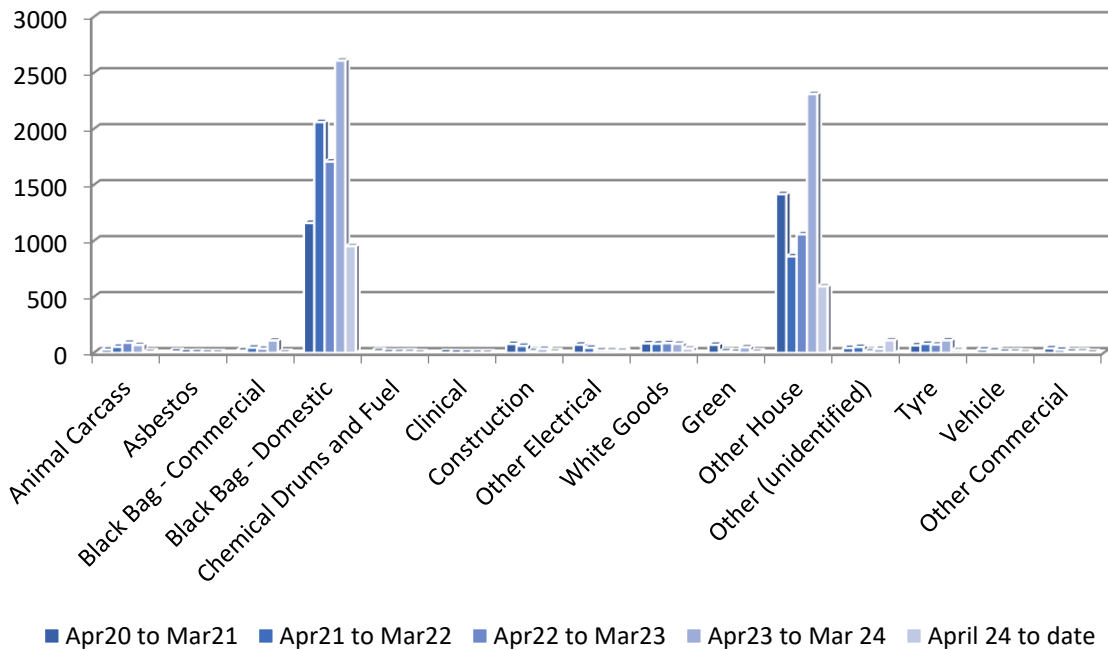
Fly tip data to the end of July 2024

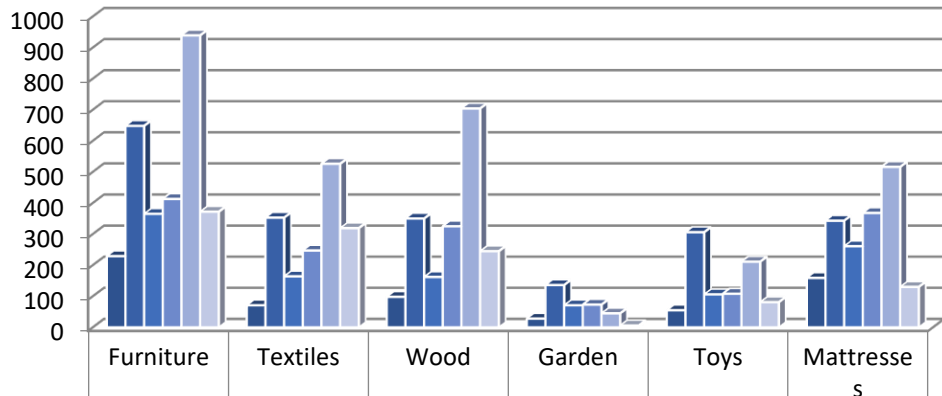

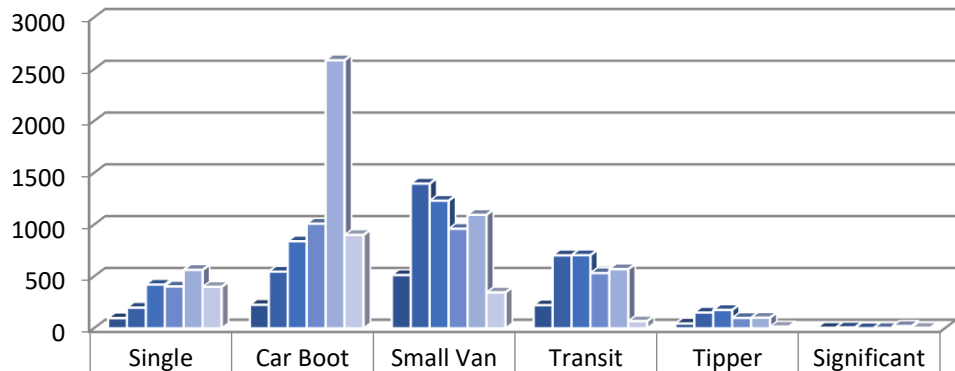
